

## AFFIDAVIT OF MYRIAM MICHAIL MOTION FOR RELIEF FROM COMPLIANCE

- I, Myriam Michail, of the City of London, in the Province of Ontario, MAKE OATH AND SAY:
- 1. My Memorandum for Leave to Appeal is the work of an educator, not a legally trained professional.
- 2. I am a Self-Represented Litigant with a disability. The hardships and barriers I face include my fragile and deteriorating health, my financial challenges and my unsuccessful attempts to secure legal representation or even legal support and advice.
- 3. Despite my extensive efforts, I was unable to secure legal representation. I have also spent much time and effort trying to secure an agent in Ottawa as would other experienced lawyers, to help me to submit my case in a succinct way in compliance with the 20 pages maximum for the memorandum for leave to appeal and to maximize my prospects of success in seeking leave.
- 4. All agents that could have helped me condense my memorandum, would not represent a SRL either informing me that Agents only deal with lawyers or claiming conflict of interest.
- 5. It is unfair that experienced lawyers can rely on the expertise of agents to produce a condensed document in compliance with the 20 pages restriction, while SRLs are denied this privilege/service and are still required to meet the same expectations.
- 6. I worked tirelessly with the help of some loyal friends, none of whom are lawyer, to try to condense the memorandum. We were unable to shorten it any further. What I am submitting

is the result of relentless efforts to produce the most succinct and complete version to the best of my ability.

- 7. At this stage I feel exhausted and distressed. I would like to sincerely apologize for the length of my Memorandum and call upon you for lenience and consideration to my situation and grant me a relief from compliance and allow for the filing of my 39 pages Memorandum.
- 8. This case is convoluted and combines two matters being the Appeal of the Ontario Court of Appeal decision and a Constitutional Challenge of National importance. As such, the requirements are condensed into one Memorandum.
- 9. The length of the litigation, the evidence and events I am required to report for the determination of my case are intertwined and overlap. Omitting information would result in serious prejudice to me.
- 10. The record amply shows that the Respondents made a procedural morass of this case. There were multiple breaches of due process at the Superior Court and the Court of Appeal which, are important to report in order to allow the Court to make a well-informed decision.
- 11. I have also bound the Memorandum prior to the list of decisions in my Book because I was unable to serial number all the decisions, prior to photocopying them. My sincere apologies.
- 12. Despite my efforts, the possibility of other technical errors or deficiencies is also probable; I apologize in advance for any inconvenience this may cause and I am kindly requesting consideration under Rule 8 of the *Rules of the Supreme Court of Canada*, and if it may arise an opportunity to correct errors when necessary.
- 13. That I make the within Affidavit in support of my Motion for Relief from Compliance for filing the Memorandum for leave to Appeal herein Pursuant to Rule 8 of the *Rules of the Supreme Court of Canada* and do so believing that the matters deposed herein are true
